Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current **2010** rules of Equine-Canada. **It is the owner, rider, trainer, coach's responsibility to be fully cognizant of the most current Equine Canada rules & regulations.**

Show management reserves the right to refuse any entry, cancel, postpone, change, or reschedule any class or condition they deem advisable. You can obtain copies of the 2007 EC & 2009 FEI Dressage tests at: <http://www.dressagecanada.org/DressageTests/dressagetests.html>.

### Entries

Entries must be received by end of day Thursday, April 22, 2010. No entries by telephone will be accepted. Late Entries will be charged \$35 per class.

Entry and all other fees must be paid by cheque, or money order, payable to **Equivents Inc. and RECEIVED WITH ENTRY FORMS BY Thursday April 22, 2010. No Credit Cards Do not send entries by courier.**

**Required memberships:** All competitors must hold an EC Gold Sport License, and be either a Dressage Canada affiliate senior or junior member. If owned by Temporary Sport License holder, a temporary horse registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404). Dressage Canada Levy fee of \$7.00 per entry charged. Exception: Competitors entered in a PARA class, if offered, are exempt from this fee. PARA riders entering the regular EC or FEI classes are required to pay the DC Levy. For more information about the DC Levy Program see [www.dressagecanada.org](http://www.dressagecanada.org)

**Equine Drug Testing:** Any horse entered in any class at a competition subject to the requirement to pay drug testing fees may, while on the competition grounds and on the recommendation of a Senior or FEI judge, FEI Veterinary Delegate, chair of the provincial Equine Medication Control Committee or the chair's appointee, be selected for equine medication control testing. Article A602.5

Your entry will only be accepted and processed if received by April 22, 2010 and if it includes:

- Completed entry form with proper signatures and stabling (optional) information
- Horse liability insurance coverage. Personal Insurance coverage (see Insurance clause in the Prize List)
- Photocopies of current Equine-Canada (EC) and Dressage Canada membership cards for riders and owners or proof/copy of a current USEF membership card.
- Horse Passport number. Not applicable to US owned horses.(owner must sign an affidavit)
- A copy of a negative Coggins or EIA test within 12 months from competition date.
- •Cheque, or Money Order for full payment (payable to Equivents Inc). No post-dated cheques (\$15 charge if sent plus late entry fee) will be accepted. **No credit cards accepted**
- Faxed Entries add \$20.(Note: Faxed entries do not waive competitor from late fees. Currently no fax # available)

### JR/AA/O Categories & Entry Rules

If a competitor/horse combination wishes to compete in more than one category, if offered, per Level they must indicate which categories on the Entry Form (e.g. Class #5 First Level Test 1 JR & O) **An entry fee must be paid for each category** the rider wishes to enter. **Each horse is limited to enter a day** (including freestyle) E 7.11.8. page 47.

## Other Show Information

**\*All Riders of any age MUST wear a protective hard riding hat at all times when ever mounted. (NNEP rule) Juniors must wear an approved protective riding hat with harness (EC & FEI rule). Cont:**

- Riders must use the designated warm-up rings.
  - Dogs or other pets must be on a leash at all times.
  - First Aid services will be available during the competition.
  - Refreshments provided by M & M Catering.
  - Horses will not be accepted on the show grounds before 12:00 (noon) on Thursday May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2010
- \*Hors Concours entries accepted if room.

## Refunds/Scratches

**Administration fees will not be refunded for any reason. Stabling fees will not be refunded after the Entry closing date Thursday, April 22, 2010.** Cancellations of entries with the required written documents will be dealt with on an individual basis with no guarantee of any refund. If accepted, the competitor may be allowed to transfer entry fees only, to the next Equivents show – no fees will be refunded. The show committee reserves the right to not consider refunds if written and signed documents are not produced/received by April 22, 2009. (a veterinarian signed letter for the horse or a letter signed from the rider's personal doctor) No cancellation/scratch refunds will be considered after April 22, 2010. In the event the competition has to be cancelled, refunds will be given after all expenses to the organizing committee are covered.

## Stabling

Permanent stalls are available for the entire competition, May 20 (noon) to May 23 (5.00pm), 2010.

Arrangements for sharing stall space must be made between competitors. Stall availability is on a first come first serve basis. Priority will be given to competing horses.

**Non-competitive horses** may be brought to the show. They must wear an identification number per EC rules and will be charged an administrative fee of \$100 for the competition and stabling fee of \$160 plus GST.

Stalls will be available at 12:00 (noon) on Thursday May 20, 2010. All stalls must be vacated by 7:00 pm on Sunday May 23, 2010 unless special arrangements are made with Equivents.

**The stall rental fee is \$160.00 for the entire show, plus GST.** Shavings are not included with the stall fee, but can be purchased in advance at the cost of \$8.00 per bag, plus GST. There will be additional shavings available for purchase during the show.

**NOTE: Shavings will not be placed in your stall. You may pick them up on your arrival, from Thursday May 20 from 12 noon to 6, 30 pm, from the shavings trailer in the stable area, Additional purchased shavings must be ordered & pick up time through the show secretary office.**

## INSURANCE

Competitors are responsible for all insurance to themselves, employees, owners & horses, etc. All owners are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

**Dress Code & Presentations** As of January 1, 2003, all Juniors must wear approved protective headgear at all times when mounted. All riders, when mounted must wear protective headgear on the competition grounds. Competitors may be required to be mounted for some Championships awards presentations and must be properly attired. Riders are requested to ride the horse/pony on which they have won the award being presented. Anyone wishing to substitute a horse/pony (for safety reasons) for presentations, must first inform and be given approval by the OC through the show steward & secretary. EC Class ribbons will be given with the dressage test at the Awards tent. EXCEPTION: Material classes will be presented at the end of each class.

## Competition Numbers

It is compulsory for the horse's competition (or in the case of a non-competition horse, the identification number) number to be worn by the horse or rider/handler anywhere outside the stall from the time that the number is issued until the end of the competition so that officials can identify the horse. Failure to display this number will incur a warning for the first offence and, in the case of second or subsequent offences, possible elimination or disqualification at the discretion of the ground jury.

## Freestyles

A horse/rider combination, to be eligible to enter the freestyle classes at a national EC competition, must have obtained the appropriate scores as outlined by the Equine Canada Dressage rulebook.

**Tapes and CD's for freestyles must be submitted to the Show Secretary no later than 5.00pm Saturday evening for all Freestyles.** IMPORTANT NOTE: To ensure proper sound checks riders are responsible to make an appointment with the announcer during lunch break on Saturday or at the end of the day. **There will be no sound checks Friday or Sunday morning.** Tapes must be rewound to the correct starting point. Tapes and CDs must be labeled with the competitor's name, horse's name, class, and any instructions. Each competitor **must have a second backup tape or CD handed in to the announcer, or readily available** in the event the first one fails (EC Art E 10. 3, 1-9.). The Announcer or OC are not responsible for incorrectly set or damaged tapes/CDs.

**The Lauren Dilanni Memorial Fund** This prize is an annual cash award split between the freestyle competitors at national shows who have at least 3 scores of 65% or more at Second level through Grand Prix freestyles. Riders who are enrolled in the Dressage Canada rider awards program may apply to the DC awards committee at the end of each show season and they will share in this memorial prize named in honour of one of Canada's most enthusiastic promoters of freestyle competition. ## EQUINE-HIPPIQUE CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

The EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring the owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel abusive nor inhumane.

### Classes and Prize Information

The OC reserves the right to limit entries, divide, cancel, or combine classes. .

Qualifying scores may be obtained for:

- Canadian FEI Young Rider, FEI Junior, FEI Pony, FEI Children FEI National Youth Championships
- North American Young Riders & Juniors Championships
- World Breeding Championships - FEI Young Horse
- Dressage Canada Short & Long Listing
- CDI Permission to Compete score

**Ribbons** will be awarded as indicated in each division. Classes with fewer than 12 entries will receive ribbons based on one for every four (4) competitors. See class listing for exceptions. Prize to winner of each class.

**Championships**, will be computed by totaling the three highest percentages of each rider/horse combination in the specific EC division/level. (Excluding freestyles), and based on the two highest percentages of each combination in all FEI divisions (excluding freestyles). Championships for Junior and Adult Amateur categories will be awarded in Training, First and Second Levels only Third Level will have an AA championship. Open Championships will be awarded at all levels Training through Fourth. EXCEPTION: A Championship may not be awarded if there are fewer than four competitors in the specific division/levels/category.

## **Materiale Classes**

All Materiale classes will be judged first in a group showing the walk, trot and canter. Afterwards they will be asked to strip and will be judged for conformation. For complete rules see the EC Dressage rulebook. Results will be based on Suitability, Paces, Manners and Conformation.

**The FEI Children Division** is offered at Equivents competitions for the fourth year. This division will be run under the FEI Rules for Children 10th edition, January 1, 2009 and 2010 EC Dressage rules where relevant.

FEI Chapter 2 Definition of a Child: 1. A Child may begin to compete as a Child from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 14. Horses only are permitted in this division.

## **PERSON RESPONSIBLE**

The Person Responsible for a horse is an adult, who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. **The Person Responsible must hold an EC individual or group license (see A203.5).** For the purpose of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.



The Dressage Canada Competitions Committee is proud to confirm the fifth year of the popular program introduced in 2006 for Equine Canada National Dressage Competitions. It is called:

### ***Dressage Canada Competitions EIGHT Award*** ***sponsored by Dominion Regalia***

This program began in 2006 and is to be used exclusively at all EC sanctioned Silver and Gold dressage competitions. The DC Competitions Committee is providing riders with this program through the generous sponsorship of Dominion Regalia.

Competitors who achieve 8 scores of 8 in the 'Rider's' mark (under Collective Marks of the test) will be awarded the new EIGHT Pin which can be worn on their riding jacket lapel. Submission forms can be downloaded from the Dressage Canada website: [www.DressageCanada.org](http://www.DressageCanada.org) Once a competitor has earned their EIGHT Pin they may continue to add bars to their EIGHT.

## **ATTENTION - FEI Young Rider Grand Prix Division**

FEI Young Rider Grand Prix Tour for riders aged between 20-25 years old. The FEI Dressage Committee announced that effective January 1, 2007; they introduced an FEI Young Rider Grand Prix Test for 20-25 year old riders test as well as a new category/tour for Young Riders. **Edition 2009 YRGP Test will be used.**

Riders taking part in this new division **if in a CDI** will not lose their eligibility for FEI Young Rider and/or Advanced divisions in a CDI or higher.. Please refer to FEI Articles 422.4 and 422.5 as well as Annex YR

**Riders and horses' eligibility will not be affected when competing in this new division at Equine Canada sanctioned and governed competitions. However any rider/horse combination competing in the Young Rider Grand Prix division at an EC sanctioned competition, must still follow the "two consecutive class" rule at the same competition.**
